Continuing Education For School Age Mothers
Webster School Nursery

1. Original proposal submitted July 1970. Revised copy submitted July 1971.
2. Initial Grant Award - November 1, 1971.
3. Webster School Advisory Committee re-activated - began November 1971.
4. Staff employed - May 1, 1972.
5. Renovations of classroom for use as Day Care Center began May 8, 1972.
6. Staff training - June, July, & August, 1972 - Presentations by staff of Howard University Child Development Center, observations and field placement - St. Ann's Infant Home, Mary McLeod Bethune Parent & Child Center, Catholic Charities Model Cities Parent & Child Center, and the Infant/Toddler Demonstration Center at the University of North Carolina.
7. Orders submitted for foods, toys, instructional materials, and equipment.
8. Staff members made furnishings and toys for center.
9. First two infants entered October 1, 1972. A total of 12 infants (6 males & 6 females) enrolled 1972-1973 school year.
10. Ages upon entering - 1 to 3 months.

12. Students using the facility are screened by the social workers. Before entering, all babies must have visited their MD and received at least 1 set of inoculations (consisting of D.P.T. & oral polio)
13. Webster's staff nurse went into the nursery twice daily to observe and participate in activities of the center during the absence of a pediatric nurse.

14. Pediatrician from Howard University Child Development Center examined infants and conferred with parents.
15. Nurse from Howard University Child Development Center administered The Denver Developmental Test to all the infants followed by parent conferences.
16. Student mothers were assigned to the nursery to assist with routine child care and infant education.
17. Pediatric nurse employed to supervise day care and infant education, May 31, 1973.
18. Mothers and infants selected for 1973 summer program.
